

Michael Spires has been working in research development since 2006, but has been working in higher education for most of his adult life. He has done research development work thus far at three different universities and also at the Smithsonian Institution. Academically, he majored in chemistry and classical languages and literatures and holds advanced degrees in classics, library and information science, and history. Most of his work in research development has focused on the physical, mathematical, and life sciences, the social sciences, and the humanities, where he has worked on more than 3,000 proposals in total, requesting more than \$100 million.

He has served as a proposal reviewer for several federal funding agencies and for numerous internal or inter-institutional programs. He has been an active member of the National Organization of Research Development Professionals (NORDP) since 2012 and served on its Board of Directors from 2014-2018, including terms as Secretary (2015-16), Vice President/President-Elect (2016-17), conference chair (9th Annual Research Development Conference), and president (2017-18). He has made more than 20 presentations to organizations such as NORDP, the Society of Research Administrators International, the University of Tennessee, the University of South Florida, and several academic conferences. His work has appeared in *The Chronicle of Higher Education* and the *SRA Catalyst*.
