

Route your Proposal with Cayuse Sponsored Projects!

After 8 years of service, the electronic PRAF is retiring! Starting July 1, 2024 Cayuse Sponsored Projects is the new proposal routing and approval process.

Principal Investigators / Project Directors will use Cayuse to route grant and contract proposals for institutional review and approval. Proposal approvers in the workflow will receive automated email messages notifying them of actions needing to be taken in Cayuse SP.

Iowa NSF EPSCoR Chemurgy 2.0 Call for Proposals

lowa NSF EPSCoR Chemurgy 2.0 is seeking proposals for projects that will provide experiences for community college and undergraduate students (especially undecided/searching students and students declared in an Advanced Biomanufacturing program); faculty and admissions/recruiter staff and/or industry staff/recruiters in Advanced Biomanufacturing to engage in shared language about

Advanced Biomanufacturing and provide a mechanism to collect and disseminate specific stories about careers in Advanced Biomanufacturing.

These projects should aim to gather and share distinctive narratives highlighting careers in Advanced Biomanufacturing, its significance in addressing societal challenges, and its role in community enhancement.

Projects must connect to at least one of the Chemurgy Focus areas. Preference will be given to projects that showcase a diverse range of individuals from Iowa, spanning various industries, educational backgrounds, and career paths.

Examples of project outcomes might include, but are not limited to: a limited or ongoing podcast, a video, a series of newspaper articles, a lesson plan, an interview protocol, a best practices document, a poster series, a digital comic book, a group of trained facilitators.

Do you manage NSF grants? Reminder to complete Responsible Conduct of Research Training.

All student / faculty / staff personnel supported by funding through the National Science Foundation (NSF) to conduct research must complete RCR training. Training must be on file with the RSP office. It is the responsibility of the PI and Department head to ensure that personnel supported through NSF have secured the correct training, prior to working on projects.

Training must be administered on the first day of employment and completed within two weeks, or prior to working on the project (whichever is sooner). Training is provided through the CITI Program and more information about the RCR training requirement may be found here.

RSP staff are currently checking the status of RCR training for staff supported on NSF projects. Noncompliance with this requirement will result in non-payment of supporting personnel with grant funds.
